



**MAURICE CLERC** joins in the continuity of the great French tradition while drawing his energy from the dynamism of our time. He is internationally renowned, have performed approximately 1,300 recitals in some twenty countries including twenty-eight tours in North America. Traveling to four continents for forty years, from Europe to Australia, his performances include Notre-Dame de Paris, the Cathedral Saint Patrick of New York, the Dom de Lubeck, the Basilica Saint Marc de Venise, the Saint Joseph's Oratory, Montreal, the Cathedral of Saint-Paul, Melbourne, the auditorium of the N.H.K. of Tokyo, and the Cultural

Center of Hong-Kong. In 1987, he was invited to give two of the concerts to inaugurate the great Flentrop organ in the new auditorium of Taipei. In 1999, he performed in Seoul for the convention of the organists. In 2003, he was again in Hong-Kong, then China, Mexico, and South Africa. In June 2019 he returned to New Zealand and Australia. In 2020 he performed in Hong-Kong and Japan.

He has been invited to perform in festivals such Bruges, Ravenna, Madrid, Morelia, Saint Eustache in Paris, Milstatt, Frankfurt, Budapest, Warsaw, Buenos-Aires and Montevideo.

Born in Lyon in 1946, Maurice Clerc was awarded a diploma at the École Normale de Musique in Paris where he studied with Suzanne Chaisemartin. At the Conservatoire de Paris, he won in 1975, First prize of organ in the class of Rolande Falcinelli. With Gaston Litaize, he continued study for several years with whom he deepened the interpretation of the repertory of the 18th century. Finally, in 1972, he had the opportunity to study improvisation with Pierre Cochereau at the International Academy of Nice. He won the Prize of Improvisation in the international competition of Lyon in 1977.

**Maurice Clerc is the Titular Organist Emeritus of the Cathédral in Dijon, France** where he served for forty-six years from 1972 until 2018. He was professor at the Conservatory of Dijon and lecturer at the Dijon University. Clerc has recorded a dozen CDs including works by Bach and other German baroque masters. Well known for his interpretation of romantic and modern repertoire, he is considered one of the great specialists of French organ music. He is often associated with the promotion of the major works of Franck, Vierne, Dupré, Fleury, and Langlais. His most recent recordings include Cochereau and French transcriptions.

Maurice Clerc is Chevalier of the Legion of Honor.
